

Enrichment Strategy: Descriptive Words

"Quad Quest"

Adjectives and Adverbs

This offline enrichment strategy helps students reinforce their understanding and mastery of descriptive words. This activity is best completed after students have had a chance to play the online Featured Games for Adjectives and Adverbs.

Goal: To increase students' understanding and proper use of adjectives and adverbs.

What You'll Need:

- Printer & copier
- Quad Quest handout, one per student (number of pages depends on how many words you want to drill)
- Pencils

What To Do:

- 1. Print template, keeping in mind it allows for 3 words to be practiced -- print 2 templates to practice 6 words, etc
- 2. Write words (either an adverb or adjective) in the center of each grid (see example below, on the first page of the handout -- the words are in red).
- 3. Make enough photocopies for all students and distribute.
- 4. Read directions with students and go over the example together.
- 5. Complete the "quad" below the example as a class.
- 6. Have students complete the remaining guads on their own.

Just In Case:

If students have difficulty with this activity...

- You can have the class complete it together as a group.
- It can be done at a center.
- A peer buddy can help struggling students.
- Students struggling with the definition may look up the word in a dictionary.
