

Enrichment Strategy: Knowing & Naming

"Name Me Five"

Plurals -- So Much More than Adding an "S"

This offline enrichment strategy helps students practice working with the different plural forms. This activity is best completed after students have had a chance to play the online Featured Games for Plural Nouns.

Goal: To help students recognize the different forms of plural nouns and spell them correctly.

What You'll Need:

- Printer & copier
- "Name Me Five" handout, one per student
- Pencils

What To Do:

- 1. Print template and make copies.
- 2. Distribute handouts to students.
- 3. Read the directions with students.
- 4. Have students complete the handout on their own.
