

Enrichment Strategy: Knowing & Using

"Teacher, May I?"

Plurals -- So Much More than Adding an "S"

This offline enrichment strategy helps students practice working with the different plural forms. This activity is best completed after students have had a chance to play the online Featured Games for Plural Nouns.

Goal: To help students recognize the different forms of plural nouns and spell them correctly.

What You'll Need:

Master checklist of nouns

What To Do:

- 1. Print the checklist for yourself.
- 2. Have students line up side by side along the far wall of the classroom, while you stand across the room.
- 3. Read off a singular noun from the list.
- 4. The first student to raise his/her hand says and spells the plural form of the noun:
 - ■You say → *mouse*
 - ■Student says \rightarrow mice, m i c e ... Teacher, may I take a step forward?
 - ■You say → Yes you may
- 5. If students raise their hand and say or spell the word incorrectly, they may not step forward. The first student to reach you wins.
